 - State Generated: Based on results from FY14 data, DTAM will set appropriate goal
 - On-site generated: Four-year graduation rate: 95% of students continuously enrolled for four years; 85% of students continuously enrolled for three years; 70% for two years; and 50% for one year.

- 2. All students will have an Individualized Learning Plan which includes their post-secondary plan and preparation.

- 1. MCIS Checklists will be reviewed and updated at least 2 X per year.
- 2. As an advisor approves projects, he/she should do a credit check in September, January, and May. Advisor connects with parents/guardians after each credit check to ensure communication with all accountable parties (in lieu of parent/teacher conferences)
- 3. At the May credit check, if a students is not on track for graduation, a plan is established to get them back on track by the end of the next school year, which may include summer projects.
- 4. Use Hope Survey results to ensure that students are reaching their goals and building on them for the future.

- 1. Personnel Committee will offer information regarding professional development opportunities.
- 2. Peer mentoring will be made available to all staff.

Committees and Roles

- > The district may establish school site teams as subcommittees of the district advisory committee.

 All advisors will be responsible for disseminating College and Career Ready materials in their advisory groups. Guidelines and lesson plans are provided by the College and Career Ready Advisory Committee.

District Reporting

The school board shall publish a report in the local newspaper with the largest circulation in the district, by mail, or by electronic means on the district website.

The school board shall hold an annual public meeting to:

- > review, and revise where appropriate, student achievement goals, local assessment outcomes, plans, strategies, and practices for improving curriculum and instruction.
- > review district success in achieving the previously adopted student achievement goals and related benchmarks and the improvement plans leading to the world's best workforce.

The school board must transmit an electronic summary of its report to the commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Education.
